

# MOTOR CAR CAMP

This camp is a unique opportunity to personally experience living history by learning to operate historic railroad motor cars.

Participants will operate a 1910 McKeen Motor Car that ran on the Virginia & Truckee Railroad, and a 1926 Edwards Motor Car. Both cars are part of the NSRM collections.

In addition to the hands-on operation of equipment, participants will learn other crew duties such as conductor and switchman. Individuals will prepare the equipment for the day's activity and conduct the maintenance required for operations.

You might get dirty. Individuals need to be able to climb on and off cars, work in confined areas and be able to lift and carry at least 25lbs over uneven ground. They also must have a valid driver's license. Sturdy, closed-toed shoes are required. Participants are required to take and pass a written NSRM Safety Test prior to class.



The McKeen Motor Car was purchased by the Virginia & Truckee Railroad in 1910 for passenger service on the line. It served until 1945. The V&T sold the body and over the years it housed 3 diners, a pottery shop, and a plumbing supply company, all in Carson City. In 1996 it was donated to the NSRM and restored.

It is the only preserved and operating McKeen Car in North America. It is listed on the National Register of Historic Places as "the best remaining example of the first commercially viable use of internal combustion propulsion in rail transportation".



The Edwards Motor Car was built in 1926 for the Tucson, Cornelia & Gila Bend Railroad by the Edwards Railway Motor Car Company of Sanford, North Carolina. It operated in regular service for the railroad until December, 31, 1947.

In 1976 it operated on the Virginia & Truckee
Railroad in Virginia City as the Washoe Zephyr and
came to the NSRM in 1988.
