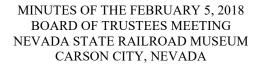

Discussion was held regarding the need for Nelson House and depot clean up and pest eradication.

Rebecca Bevans reported that the next Event Committee meeting will be Friday, February 9 at 12:30 PM. Rebecca is in the process of organizing an event crew with defined tasks.
